Weathered barrel

Corrosion and rusting in metals are extremely common with the pass of time, though sometimes difficult to depict on a model. This guide shows an easy step by step process to age and weather a barrel quickly and with spectacular results.

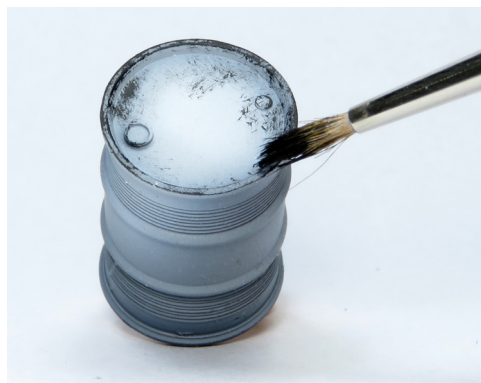
- 1 With Black Surface Primer 70.602 the barrel is primed applying 3 fine layers by airbrush.



- 2 The base color Medium Sea Grey 70.870 is airbrushed.



- 3 A mixture 80% White 70.951 and 20% Medium Sea Grey is applied to highlight the upper part of the barrel.



- 4 Using an old brush several scratches are applied with Black Glaze 70.855. It's important not to add any water to the color.



- 5 The best way to create the wearing is by releasing a bit of paint on a paper, then place the brush on the area that needs painting and drag the paint until the wearing effect is achieved.



- 6 Several effects such as oil or rust stains are applied to the barrel with the colors Petrol Spills 73.817, Oil Stains 73.819 and Rust Texture 73.821.



- 7 Dry rust is applied to the lower joints of the barrel with Burnt Sienna 73.106.



- 8 Lastly, washes are applied with Blue Green 70.808 to achieve the effect of corrosive liquid.



- 9 Final result.
