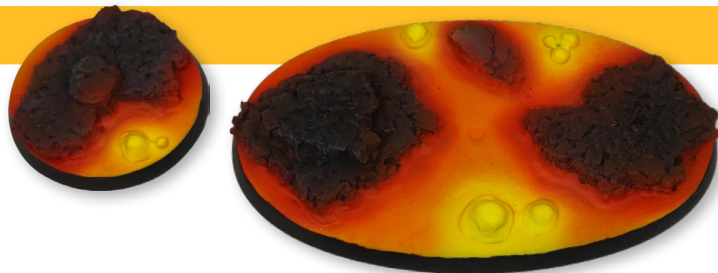

## Lava bases

This guide shows how to create and paint lava bases step by step for our miniatures and wargames.

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- 1 Firstly, the bases are prepared by adding some cork. In addition, we can add other elements such as stones or rocks.



- 2 Using green putty, small balls of different sizes are created and glued to the base. The objective of these small balls is to create the bubbling lava effect.



- 3 Apply a generous layer of PVA glue all over the base. This layer will hide the texture that some bases have, as well as providing an ideal base to simulate lava.



- 4 Everything is left to dry for several hours. Once dry the base will look like this. The bases are ready to begin the painting process.



- 5 A black primer is applied, using Hobby Paint Spray Black 28.012 or Surface Primer Black 70.602.



- 6 A dry brush is made using Model Color Neutral Grey 70.992, preferably with a flat brush (PM05 Vallejo model).



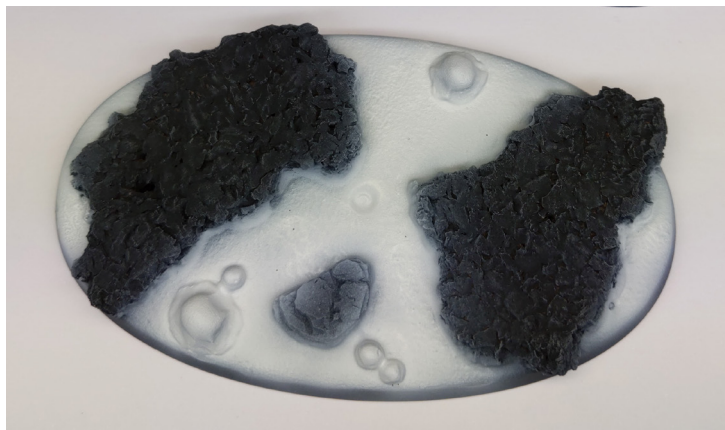

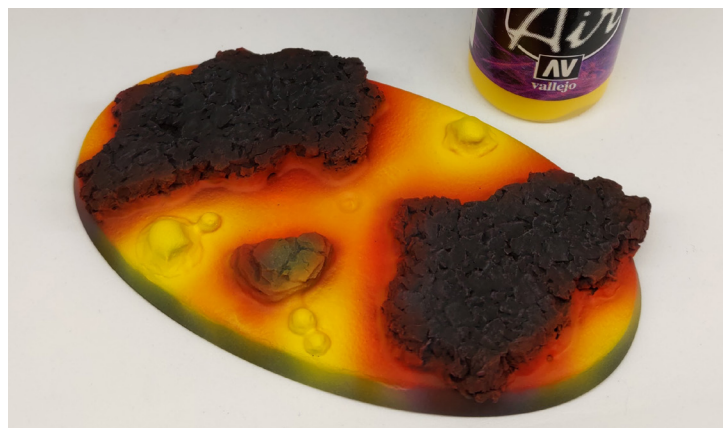
- 7 The airbrush will be used from now on. Firstly, a first coat of Dead White 72.701 is applied.



- 8 Red RLM23 71.003 is applied to all the areas closest to the rocks. Part of the rocks are painted too.



- 9 We continue with Orange Fire 72.708, covering the rest of the surface, except for the small balls of bubbling lava.



- 10 The small bubbling balls are painted using Moon Yellow 72.705.



- 11 The base is finished by painting the edges, using Model Color Black 70.950.
